

## Micrologus and Micrologus' Library Essential Editorial Rules

### Quotation of a book :

- a. the first name(s) only abbreviated = R.
- b. the title in Italique = *Rome in the Middle Ages*
- c. no colon between the name of the editorial place and the year of publication = Paris 2007 and not Paris, 2007
- d. No indication of the Publisher (Paris 2007 and not Paris, Gallimard, 207)
- e. no p. or pp.
- f. for the number of the pages : **301-2** or **301-12** and not 301-302 or 311-312  
**101-2** or **1311-12** and not 1301-1302 or 1301-02 or 1311-1312

Example: M. M. Sassi, *La scienza dell'uomo nella Grecia antica*, Torino 1988, 123-46.

Second and following quotations : only the last name and the first words of the title  
Exemple: Sassi, *La scienza*, 45.

### Quotation of an article:

author : as for the book  
title of the article : between « », followed by a colon, then the title of the Journal in *Italique*  
then colon, space, number of the Journal, date in round brackets, colon, number of the pages as in the following example :

Example: M. Grignasci, «La diffusion du Secretum Secretorum (Sirr-al-asrâr) dans l'Europe occidentale», *Archives d'histoire doctrinale et littéraire du Moyen Age*, 48 (1981), 1-69.

### Quotation of an article in a collective work

author : as for a book  
title of the article : as in the case of a quotation of an article  
the title of the collective work is preceded by in  
the rest is the same as for a quotation of a book

Exemple: A. Ghisalberti, «Somatologia tardomedievale: i problemi del corpo in Gioivanni Buridano», in *Il corpo, perché? Saggi sulla struttura corporea della persona*, Brescia 1979, 195-210.
