



This international conference explores the passage from visual theories elaborated in the Medieval East and Latin Worlds to the development of artistic theories of linear perspective in early 15<sup>th</sup> century Florence.

Under the aegis of the «Transcultural Conferences» promoted by the Union Académique Internationale and hosted by the «Micrologus International Conferences», the International Conference brings together eminent academics in the fields of Medieval science and philosophy and Renaissance studies to debate the cultural, scientific and artistic developments that made such a transition possible. Beginning with Alhazen's influential *De aspectibus* and its Arab and Latin reception, the conference aims to explore the late-medieval 'perspectivism' in the context of the work and ideas of Florentine artists and architects.
